It is now standard practice to grade the task rather than the text, and handling authentic materials at lower levels has been extensively discussed". (Anderson and Lynch 1988: 80-96). For a very basic example, you can use the Pete Seeger song Little Boxes with a beginner's class as long as it is made clear that the goal is to understand the song, not every word, but only to jot down the words that are colored.
