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DEVELOPMENT OF MILITARY INTELLIGENCE IN THE AMIR TEMUR'S TROOPS

Abstract: This article includes an analysis of the political and socio-economic situation during the reign of Amir Temur, coverage of the structure and methods of work of the intelligence apparatus in his army, as well as a study of the main areas of intelligence activities and key cases of using intelligence in combat operations.
