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## PROBLEMS FACED IN TEACHING PRIMARY CLASS STUDENTS TO WRITING

**Abstract:** The article talks about the typical mistakes that occur when teaching elementary school students to write, and ways to eliminate them. Information about interactive methods aimed at improving literacy is provided. Also, the specific aspects of the professional skills of primary school teachers are highlighted.

A number of problems can arise when teaching elementary school students to write. Identifying these gaps, understanding them, and finding effective teaching methods is the task of every pedagogue. We will dwell on the problems encountered in teaching elementary school students to write, and ways to overcome them.

A child entering the 1st grade gets used to school life, spending 45 minutes in a certain place is a bit difficult for students at the beginning of the school year. After learning the letters and having the ability to write words, you can overcome these shortcomings by creating a story based on the picture or writing down the favorite activities of the students. In particular, writing skills and written speech are formed by creating a small text consisting of 4-5 sentences on topics such as "My hobby", "I help my mother".

Sometimes pedagogues make mistakes when teaching the writing process.

We can cite examples of these: not devoting enough time to husnikhat, paying more attention to other subjects. Because of this, problems arise in the development of writing.

To give elementary school students more writing practice, to devote more time to it, and to form beautiful writing, we will hold the contest "The owner of the most beautiful writing" every

month, and the winning student's notebook will be a model for everyone. It is appropriate to hang it in the corner of the classroom.

It is also necessary to pay attention to the oral speech of primary school students. For example: "O" and "U"; "X" and "H"; It is necessary to prevent shortcomings by correctly teaching the literal expression of sounds such as "o" and "u". In this regard, it is necessary to use special exercises, to repeat the pronunciation through several words, to organize speech-related games and interactive exercises.

It is the duty of every pedagogue to eliminate such shortcomings. It depends on the skill of the teacher to adapt the young bird to the educational environment without hurting his heart or extinguishing his interests. At this point, it is appropriate to emphasize this speech of Mahatma Gandhi: "Education is a process designed to develop the human spirit." Gandhi emphasizes the importance of education and its place in not only intellectual but also spiritual development. Learning and teaching letters serves not only knowledge for children, but also the development of self-confidence and inner capabilities.

Learning letters is just the beginning of learning. They give us a better understanding of the world, create an opportunity to clearly express our thoughts and learn more deeply. For every child, learning is a process of growth and development. Therefore, learning letters for each student is not only a stage of education, but the main foundation of their future, dreams and success. Every small step can lead to big achievements one day. Supporting and patiently guiding them in the learning process is one of the important tasks of a primary education teacher.

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
