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THE EDUCATIONAL VALUE OF TEACHING ALISHER NAVOI'S WORKS IN PRIMARY READING CLASSES

Annotation: This article talks about the life and activities of the great poet and thinker, statesman Alisher Navoi, the content and essence of the narrative "Reasonable answer", educational and ideological aspects that serve as an example for students. Alisher Navoi's words of wisdom, rich in meaning, were also commented on.

Alisher Navoi, the king of words, a great thinker, the founder of Turkish literature, a poet who glorified humanity, goodness, purity, honesty, patriotism and peace. The more we praise this great person, the less. Alisher Navoi embodies honesty, love, manners, goodness, honesty and other human qualities in his works. Nowadays, it is natural that such human qualities should serve as an example for the growing young generation.

In the 2nd grade reading literacy textbook, the narration of the great scholar "The Reasonable Answer" is given.

Narration is derived from the Arabic word, to tell a story, a genre of oral history, folklore, which describes events and events, human activities, sometimes through fiction, sometimes realistically.

At the core of the narrative are memories of historical past events based on folk stories passed down from generation to generation. The narrative is always told in the first person.

According to the textbook, there will be a conversation between Husayn Boygaro, Alisher Navoi and his students. We can see in this passage that Husayn Boygaro and Navoi spoke through signs in the narration of "Reasonable Answer", and their students were amazed and amazed at their intelligence when they learned what these signs meant:

Alisher Navoi was the prime minister in the palace of Husayn Boykara, governor of Khorasan. The king always listened to Navoi's advice. One day, before entering the palace in the morning, Husayn Boygaro appeared to Navoi and pointed to his head with his index finger. Navoi also showed his tongue with the same finger. Husayn Boygaro shook his head and returned to his tracks without entering the palace. Navoi explains the meaning of this passage from the narration to his students:

"Husayn Boygaro asked: 'What brings trouble to the head?', I answered: 'Language.'" It is impossible not to admire Navoi's intelligence and ingenuity in these passages. Using bad words is a bad thing. Because they don't say "Keep your tongue safe" - for nothing. When Allah bestows every boon on his servant, he will be grateful if he appreciates the bounties given to him and uses them only for good deeds.

Language is the smallest organ of a human being, but it deserves great attention in terms of responsibility and function. We are responsible for every word we say.

Muhammad (s.a.v) commanded to guard the tongue from inappropriate words and to keep silence as much as possible: "Whoever believes in Allah and the Last Day, let him speak only good things or keep silent." The reason why so much attention is paid to the language in Islam is that language is close to the heart. A person whose heart is clean and pure will always speak good words. Whoever wants my head to be saved should refrain from bad words and always speak the right and true words. "Even if a sword comes to your head, speak the truth" is not said for nothing.

Wise words are short and concise phrases, stanzas, and sentences that express a complete thought. Wise words, unlike folk proverbs, belong to a certain person in terms of origin. Alisher Navoi's works are full of wise words and their place in human education is incomparable. For example, "Nazm ul-Javahir", "Arbain", "Mahbub ul-Qulub" and others. Alisher Navoi's wise words are meant as admonition. For example:

1. Who taught you a letter on the path of truth,

It's an irreplaceable gift, and it's worth a hundred gems.

This wisdom is a lesson for each of us, about how to do justice to the teacher. Because it is not for nothing that the teacher is said to be greater than your father.

2. A scientist who studied what he did not know by asking,

A tyrant who did not ask. In fact, it is necessary to constantly improve one's knowledge and not to be afraid of it.

3. Say what you can say, refrain from what you can't say.

There is another wise saying of the thinker, which is written on the facades of many buildings:

He learns little by little and becomes wise.

Drop by drop collects and becomes a river. These wise words of Navoi took place in classrooms. Therefore, every student should read these golden words, understand their meaning and apply them in their lives.

The words of wisdom are on a variety of topics: virtues, virtues, always leading the way. The words of wisdom given in the textbook are about making students interested in reading more

and asking questions about what they don't know, that the knowledge they are learning now will lead to a bright future when they grow up, and the example of the river will have an infinite size. Following Alisher Navoi's wisdom is obligatory for every generation.

To sum up, reading and learning the high examples of Alisher Navoi's work, promoting his immortal ideas, has a special place in helping our youth to realize their identity, to raise their spirituality, to educate them in the spirit of patriotism, on the basis of universal ideals. It should also be said that the narration and wise words written in the spirit of advice in the 2nd grade reading literacy textbook are not included for nothing. Students should read and learn such exemplary stories from a young age and acquire the human qualities that belong to them and follow them.

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
